

HIGHLIGHTS

In spring 2013, 215 students applied for admission to Montclair State University as new freshmen. Montclair State University accepted 41 percent (87) of these applicants. Sixty-four percent (56) of those accepted enrolled in classes.

Full-time, First-time Freshmen

In spring 2013, the CSAT score was 981 for accepted full-time, first-time freshmen, regardless of admission type, and 964 for those who enrolled. The average class rank was 65 for accepted students and 64 for enrolled students.

Fifty-three percent of enrolled full-time, first-time freshmen were female. Of those who disclosed their race/ethnicity information, 4 percent were Asian or Pacific Islander, 22 percent were Black/African American, 33 percent were Hispanic and 33 percent were White. Just over 4 percent indicated they were two or more races. Additionally, 4 percent were international students.

Almost 94 percent of full-time, first-time freshmen resided in New Jersey. Over 62 percent of all full-time, first-time enrolled freshmen came from four counties: Essex (22 percent), Passaic (16 percent), Bergen and Hudson (12 percent each). Six percent did not reside in New Jersey.

First-time Transfers

In spring 2013, 2,201 first-time, full- and part-time transfer students applied to MSU, an increase of 8% from the 2,038 students who applied last spring. Fifty-seven percent of those applying were accepted. Sixty-five percent (816) enrolled in classes.

Fifty-seven percent of enrolled first-time, full- and part-time transfer students were female. Of those who disclosed their race/ethnicity information, 7 percent were Asian or Pacific Islander, 11 percent were Black/African-American, 29 percent were Hispanic and 46 percent were White. Almost 4 percent indicated they were two or more races. Additionally, over 2 percent were international students.

Over 59 percent of newly enrolled transfer students transferred from New Jersey public community colleges. Over half of the New Jersey community college students came from three community colleges in particular: Bergen Community College (29%), Essex County College County and College of Morris (13% each).

In total, 872 new undergraduate students started MSU in spring 2013. New transfer students made up 94 percent of all new students, followed by new freshmen at 6 percent.
