

HIGHLIGHTS

In the fall of 2014, Montclair State University yielded 3,180 applicants for its graduate degree, certification, certificate and non-certificate programs. This figure (3,180) refers to completed and incomplete applications. Just over 82 percent (2,614) actually completed the application process. Those with completed applications make up the application base from which the numbers and percents in the accompanying tables were drawn.

The percentage of completed applications for degree seeking students was 79%; 11% applied as non-degree students, 4% applied for certification programs and another 6% applied for certificate programs.

This fall, the University accepted 58% of its applicants. Of those accepted, 78% (1,176 students) enrolled in classes for the semester.

The average verbal and math Graduate Record Exam (GRE) test scores for enrolled degree-seeking graduate students in a Masters program were 150.3 and 147.4, respectively. These scores reflect the revised GRE test score scales. The average score for the Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT) was 477.2. The average undergraduate GPA for enrolled Masters-seeking graduate students was 3.34. The average verbal and math Graduate Record Exam (GRE) test scores for enrolled degree-seeking graduate students in a Doctoral program were 153.9 and 150.7, respectively.

Just over 72 percent of first-time enrolled graduate students were female. This fall, 6% did not supply information about their race/ethnicity. Of the enrolled students who supplied this information, 60% were white; 11% were Black/African American; 16% were Hispanic/Latino; 5% were Asian; and over 2% indicated they were of two or more races. Additionally, 5% were non-resident aliens.

Over 60 percent of the first-time enrolled graduate students from NJ came from four counties: Bergen, 21%; Essex, 19%; Passaic, 12% and Morris, 10%. Ten percent of students came from outside New Jersey (other states or countries).
